### **Vaccines:**

The flu and/or pneumonia vaccine(s) have been administered to residents on health care who requested them. Residents on assisted living and memory support who have requested the vaccine(s) will receive them on Wednesday, October 7.

### **COVID Tests:**

Residents on health care were tested last Friday with a rapid response test as required by LHD after the positive staff test last Wednesday. This week, also as required by the LHD, health care residents were included in the routine COVID testing done with staff, and the samples were sent to the lab. This process of testing will continue at least through next week. The Hanover County positivity rates have decreased and we are optimistic they will continue at the lower rate. Once the conditions indicate less frequent testing for staff and other health providers, we should see services like the salon return to Manor East.

### **Quarantine:**

Manor East is still quarantined. That means that residents are not able to visit other parts of the campus, and appointments off campus should be for medically necessary purposes only. Visitation is limited to outdoor visits and window visits. Only compassionate care (end-of-life) visits are permitted in-room.
